EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED

We all know what to expect of Easter: lots of lilies around the altar, our "Alleluia" joyfully sung over and over, perhaps a tasty ham dinner later in the day, topped off by some chocolates from the Easter basket. But all of this began, as we hear in today's Gospel, with the "unexpected" when Mary Magdalene found the tomb empty. Indeed, Peter's speech from Acts in the first reading could insert the phrase "you might have expected" at a number of points . . . that Jesus would baptize John, not the other way around . . . that his healing and exorcising ministry would win him acclaim, not death . . . that his resurrection would place him in another dimension, not back at table with his followers. On a day like Easter, a day filled with traditions, customs, and expectations, we are called more than ever to keep looking for God's will in unexpected places, people, and events. In this way we can continue to give witness, like Mary Magdalene and Peter, that Christ is truly risen from dead, and continues to live among us.

MENSAJE DE PASCUA

“Sí, dinos otra vez, Maria: ¿Qué viste en tu viaje? Vi la tumba de uno que vive todavía y la gloria del resucitado.” El corazón de la fe de Pascua resuena con estas palabras. Maria Magdalena, cuyo amor la trajo a la cruz y vio como Jesús fue envuelto para el entierro, fue visto por ultima vez en el Evangelio sentado en la tumba. Después del día Sábado, ella y la otra Maria volvieron a la tumba, ya estaba vacía, y fueron las primeras en experimentar el poder del resucitado. Cada Evangelio de la mañana de Pascua tiene su propia belleza distintiva. Las mujeres llegan al amanecer, simbólicamente el amanecer de un día nuevo en la historia humana. El Evangelio de Mateo nos dice que el ángel—mueve la piedra de la tumba y se sienta en ella, otro símbolo visual de la victoria sobre la muerte. La proclamación de Pascua no es simplemente una conclusión feliz a un cuento trágico. Esto capta el ritmo del fin de la confrontación con el sufrimiento y la muerte transformados por la vida. Las mujeres no buscaban a Jesús el maestro, si no “al crucificado,” y encontraron que la muerte no lo pudo contener. Estas mujeres, los seguidores y los que anuncian fielmente la resurrección, hoy tienen muchos hermanos y hermanas que nutren una cultura del amor y la alegría en presencia de la muerte. Fundamentalmente la gente cree que esa muerte no es el fin de vida si no la puerta a la plenitud de la vida con el Cristo resucitado, que en su transformación humana permanece entre nosotros, herido y transformado. Ellos son esos cristianos cuyo temor no dirige a una deformación de la verdad pero a la proclamación alegre, y que decreta un Evangelio de la alegría en su vida diaria. Las mujeres corrieron de la puerta de la muerte para proclamar la palabra de la vida. ¿Seguiremos nosotros?

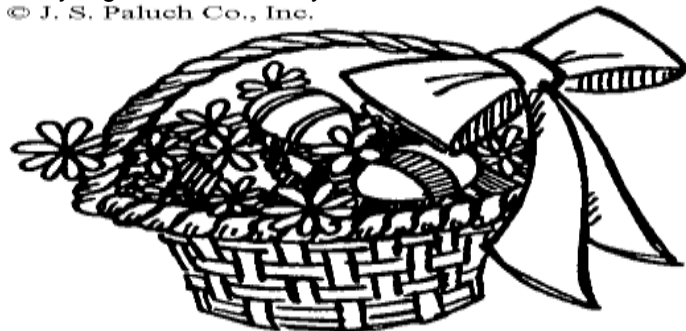
NOW ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR THE PRESCHOOL

Es más, en la primera lectura, Pedro, en su discurso en los Hechos podría haber insertado la frase "uno hubiera esperado" en varios puntos...que Jesús bautizara a Juan, y no al revés... que su ministerio de curar y liberar de los demonios le hubiera ganado aclamación, y no la muerte... que su resurrección lo colocaría en otra dimensión, no de vuelta a la mesa con sus seguidores. En un día como la Pascua, un día lleno de tradiciones, costumbres y expectativas, más que nunca somos llamados a seguir buscando la voluntad de Dios en lugares, personas y sucesos inesperados. De esta manera, podemos continuar dando testimonio, como María Magdalena y Pedro, que Cristo de veras ha resucitado de entre los muertos y continúa viviendo en medio nuestro.

EASTER MESSAGE

"Yes, tell us again, Mary: what did you see on your journey? I saw the tomb of one who still lives and the glory of the risen one." The core of Easter faith resounds through these words. Mary Magdalene, whose love brought her to the cross and who watched as Jesus was wrapped for burial, was last seen in the Gospel setting at the tomb. After the Sabbath, she and the other Mary came again to the tomb, the abode of the dead, and were the first to see it emptied of its power and to experience the presence of the risen one. Each Easter morning Gospel has its own distinctive beauty. The women arrive at dawn, symbolically the dawning of a new day in human history. Matthew's Gospel records that the angel—rolls the stone away and sits on it, another visual symbol of the victory over death. The Easter proclamation is not simply a happy ending to a tragic story. It captures the unending rhythm of confrontation with suffering and death transformed by life. The women were seeking not Jesus the teacher, but "the crucified one," and find that death could not contain him. These women, faithful followers and heralds of the resurrection, have many brothers and sisters today who nurture a culture of love and joy in the face of death. Fundamentally such people believe that death is not the meaningless end of life, but the door to the fullness of life with the risen Christ, who in his transformed humanity remains one of us, wounded and transformed. They are those Christians whose fear does not lead to a distortion of the truth but to joyful proclamation, and who enact a Gospel of joy and life in their daily lives. The women ran from the door of death to proclaim the word of life. Shall we follow?
